





Tapping into Waipā

Waipā's northern neighbours are wooing he council in an apparent effort to get the ocal authority to join their water services

Discussions were held behind closed doors n Te Awamutu vesterday (Wednesday) etween Hamilton, Waikato and Waipā districts and were believed to have included a veetener deal around water meters and the owth issues the three of them face.

The public excluded workshop comes as nerger debate among Waikato's 12 local horities - fuelled by the need to sort out heir water arrangements - has been rekindled.

If Waipā went with Hamilton and Waikato wer water, organisations like Waikato Chamber of Commerce - which argues council malgamations should be dominating this ocal body election year - would ramp up the

News of the water meeting came as a surprise to Otorohanga and Waitomo mayors Max Baxter and John Robertson who both said was critical to have Waipā in the Waikato Nator Done Well deal with them Matamata. Piako South Waikato Thames Coromandel and Taupō.

Waipā agreed to a non-binding head of agreement with the rural councils in Waitomo and Otorohanga councils are

already facing ratepayer revolt over double digit rate increases and Robertson is in the "it's "It no longer makes any sense for our

two King Country councils to duplicate ninistration and pass costs onto ratepayers the way we do." he said.

Baxter said there was "a real need" for Waipā to be in the water mix.
"If Waipā left, that would change the whole lynamic and would be to the detriment of

Waikato Water Done Well," Baxter said. "It's ust a whole new discussion."

"It would be poor form if they did not investigate opportunities." His views on a merger with Waitomo are

no secret - he wants Otorohanga to look north towards Waipā. Robertson said Waipā district was "really important" to the Waikato Water Done Well

proposal. "It's the biggest council in terms of population," he said. An estimated 62,700 people live in Waipa - a quarter of the 207,000 residents in the regional

proposal With population comes the ability to collect rates to fund capital projects.
"I am very keen to see all seven councils

that have signed up to stay in the group," said Robertson. "If we can do that then the option is very feasible. I have no reason to believe that Waipā won't stay with us because we can make a

great option." Both Waipā and Waikato installed meters eight years ago while Hamilton water usage is included in general rates. The News understands Hamilton would need to commit to a targeted city only rate to pay for their

installation In a statement last year, Waipā mayor Susan O'Regan said "this decision will likely be the biggest one our elected members will face as a council. It will impact Waipā for many generations to come

Under Local Water Done Well legislation, all councils are required to produce a water services delivery plan by September - the month before local body elections - ensuring future delivery is financially sustainable and meets quality standards.

Soaked and stoked



Make a splash this summer at the Z Manu World Championships! With the Wellington super qualifier round slipping and sliding into Wellington Regional Aquatic Centre in Kilbirnie on the 25" and 26" of January, this nationwide dive-bombing championship is for the young and young at heart.

Over 2000 participants took part in last year's inaugural championship event. Legends were made, champions crowned, and fun abounded. Famous faces joined the fun, including former All Blacks captain Sean Fitzpatrick and rugby legend Piri Weepu [pictured] who will return in 2025.

"Last year, we were literally testing the waters," organiser Scott Rice says. "We saw the widespread love for manu across the country, and we proved that even those who've never popped a manu can enjoy the

atmosphere while witnessing the incredible skill of 'manu athletes' from around the nation".

Manu techniques are perfected at wharves, pools, and secret spots across Actearoa, only coming into the limelight once a year. The judges panel will use ManuTech at the Wellington super qualifiers and grand finals in Auckland on the 1° of March. This software records each jump on film, so that each splash height can be carefully calculated before receiving a score.

This year's categories include pakeke/adult for those 18 and over, rangatahi/youth for those between 13 and 17, tamariki/kids open to 10 to 12-year-olds, and an eight-plus freestyle section.



The Z Manu World Champs is getting bigger this summer with more qualifiers being held

Pop the right manu and you could bring home a world champion title, bragging rights, and a share of a \$40,000 prize pool.

After last summer saw the debut of the Z Manu World Championships, the one-ofa-kind competition will return in its second iteration with new cities on board, more prize money up for grabs, and cutting-edge technology introduced to determine the winners.

The manu is said to be a New Zealand invention and is one of Kiwis' favourite things to do around the water. The unique bomb technique requires one's body to form a distinct V-shape so the bum and lower back hit the water first, before the arms and legs are immediately extended back out to create a deafening clap and a soaring splash.

With over 2000 people competing across the motu last year, including former All Blacks captain Sean Fitzpatrick and retired rugby star Piri Weepu, the unique contest is being opened up to a wider range of participants, with organisers working with communities to set up qualifiers for the grand final in some of the country's smaller cities.

While last year's competition required many participants to travel long journeys to make the official qualifying rounds held in Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Hamilton, five more regional cities have pledged to run their own for the upcoming world championships.






