Green takes on Waitomo Trail Run



Last year's Bachelor Art Green and Matilda Rice have signed up for the 33km course on Saturday.

Organisers describe the Trail Run as the most unique geographical trail on the planet, which takes runners and walkers underground and over-ground across stunning 6km, 11km, 22km or 33km courses.

The 22km and 33km course will take participants over towering rock faces, allow them to navigate through bush and over karst-studded landscapes, before descending the beautiful 'Love Track'.

Following on from the Tarawera Ultra and Tarawera Trail Marathon, this is only the third event organisers Paul Charteris and Tim Day have offered in nine years.

Located in the ultimate playground in the Waitomo region, the course will weave runners and walkers through an underground and over ground thoroughfare of karst-studded landscapes, native bush, vibrant working farms, tunnels, canyons and glowworms.
